Trinity in Community

• Existed eternally:

- Father exists eternally: (John 1:1, 14, 18)
- Son exists eternally: (John 1:1)
- Spirit exists eternally: (Heb 9:14)

Loved eternally:


- Does not need our love in order to be fulfilled
- The love of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are eternal

Person vs. Being

- Very important to note, the Trinity is NOT teaching:
 - 3 Persons in I Person
 - 3 Beings in I Being
- Rather, 3 Persons in the I Beings of God

Person vs. Being

- A rock has the being of a rock,
 - but does not have a person
 - No personality/consciousness
- A man has the Being of a Human
 - This Being has I Person
 - I Personality




The Trinity is:

- 3 distinct, co-equal, co-eternal Persons
 - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- These Persons are the I Being of God (YHWH)
 - God's Being includes 3-Persons
 - It's wrong to assume that a "Being can only have I Person"
- For God, "Being" has no physical propertieso Namely, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit


God is:

- I Eternal Being of God (YHWH)
 - the WHAT
- In 3 Eternal Persons (Father, Son, Spirit)
 - the WHO
 - I "What" and 3 "Whos"



Biblical Basis for the Trinity

- I. There is one, and only one, God
- 2. The person of the Father is God
- 3. The person of the Son is God
- 4. The Person of the Holy Spirit is God
- 5. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are distinct and simultaneously distinguishable persons
- 6. But there is only one God


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Economic Trinity






Gender of God

- The Bible describes the Father & Son in masculine terms
- the Spirit is feminine in Hebrew (Ruach) and neuter in Greek (Pneuma)
- It's appropriate to call God "He"
- Terms of gender speak to relation, not gender identity




- Importance:

First Temple

- First Temple period
 - Solomon's Temple
- Constructed in the 10th century (960) BC by King Solomon
- Destroyed by the Babylonians in 587/586 BCE



- God (theos) becomes the name for the Father, Lord (kurios) becomes the name for the Son/Jesus

Jesus is Yahweh

- "For although there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth as indeed there are many "gods" and many "lords" yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and for whom we exist." (I Cor 8:5-6)
 - reworking the Shema in Christological language!!!
 - "Hear O Israel, the LORD our God, the LORD is one"
 - "Israel, pay attention to this: Yawheh, our God, Yahweh is the only God!

Jesus is Yahweh

- Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way, the voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord (kurios), make his paths straight." (Mark 1:2-3)
- "In the wilderness prepare the way of Yahweh (LORD), make straight in the desert a highway for our God." (Is 40:3)

- Rev 5:To the Son/Lamb
 - Worthy are you to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation, and you have made them a kingdom and priests to our God, and they shall reign on the earth.

Equality statements

- Rev 5 (duel worship to Father & Son)

 - Therefore they are before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence...
 - For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd



Lord of the Sabbath

- Exodus 20:9 "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God...Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy."
- 31:12-17"...You are to speak to the people of Israel and say, 'Above all you shall keep my Sabbaths, for this is a sign between me and you throughout your generations, that you may know that I, the Lord, sanctify you. You shall keep the Sabbath, because it is holy for you. Everyone who profanes it shall be put to death... Whoever does any work on the Sabbath day shall be put to death. Therefore the people of Israel shall keep the Sabbath, observing the Sabbath throughout their generations, as a covenant forever."

Lord of the Sabbath

- Mark 2:25-28 (Luke 6:1-5; Matthew 12:1-8)
 - "Have you never read what David did, when he was in need and was hungry, he and those who were with him: how he entered the house of God, in the time of Abiathar the high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and also gave it to those who were with him?" And he [Jesus] said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. So the Son of Man is lord even of the Sabbath."

Son of Man

- I. General humanity (Psalm 8:3-4)
 - When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?
- 2. As prophet (Ezekiel 2)
- 3. In Messianic/Divine terms (Dan 7:13)
 - behold, with the clouds of heaven there came one like a son of man, and he came to the Ancient of Days and was presented before him...

Clouds

- Image for God's presence: Ex 13:21; 19:9
- God's presence in the Tabernacle: Ex 40:35
- God Riding on cloud: Is 19:1
- God's Judgment Is 30:30

Son of Man

- 7:9 Ancient of Days took his seat; his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool
- Rev 1:13-14 in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed in a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest. The hairs of his head were white, like white wool, like snow
- Son of Man is referring to:
 - Jesus' humanity, role as prophet, Messianic rule and equality with God



Humanity of the Son

 Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

• Phil 2:5-8

- Human birth and a human genealogy (Gal. 4:4–5)
- Human body that experienced
 - growth (Luke 2:40, 52)
 - hunger (Matt. 4:2)
 - thirst (John 19:28)
 - tiredness (John 4:6)
 - death (Luke 23:46)

- Physical body in resurrected state (John 20:17, 25–27)
- Human mind that had limitations in knowledge (Mark 13:32)
- Increased in wisdom (Luke 2:52)
- Learned obedience (Heb. 5:8–9)

- Experienced human temptation
 - "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin" (Heb. 4:15; cf. Luke 4:1–2)
- Every kind of human temptation, he never succumbed to sin (John 8:29, 46; 15:10; 2 Cor. 5:21; Heb. 7:26; I Pet. 2:22; I John 3:5)

- Jesus practiced spiritual disciplines:
- Regularly prayed (Mark 14:36; Luke 10:21; Heb. 5:7)
- Worshiped at the synagogue (Luke 4:16)
- Read & memorized Scripture (Matt. 4:4–10)
- Practiced solitude (Mark 1:35; 6:46)
- Observed the Sabbath (Luke 4:16)
- Obeyed OT ceremonial laws (John 8:29, 46; 15:10; 2 Cor. 5:21; Heb. 4:15)
- Received the fullness of the Spirit (Luke 3:22; 4:1)

THE IN 3 PERSONS

Implications Humanity

- Jesus' humanity enables his representative obedience for us (Rom. 5:18–19)
- Jesus' humanity makes him the only effective mediator between God and man: (1 Tim. 2:5)
- Jesus' divine and human natures enable him to stand in the gap between fallen humans and a holy God

Personhood

- I. Jesus Christ is fully and completely divine
- 2. Jesus Christ is fully and completely human
- 3. The divine and human natures of Christ are distinct
- 4. The divine and human natures of Christ are completely united in one person
 - 100% Man
 - 100% God

Dual Nature

- Jesus is clearly portrayed as a real human
 AND as the God of Israel
 - If Jesus is God, then He has an unchangeable (immutable) nature
 - He is always God, and cannot-not be God

Resurrection

- I. God/Theos
 - Acts 3:14-15 1 Corinthians 6:14
- 2. God the Father
 - Galatians I:I I Thessalonians I:9-10
- 3.The Son/Jesus
 - John 2:18-22 John 10:17-18
- 4. The Spirit
 - | Peter 3:18

Therefore

- Jesus was 100% man and 100% God
 - Jesus the man died (Flesh)
 - The eternal Son of God did not die (Spirit)
- Yahweh (Father, Son, Holy Spirit- The Triune Godhead) raised Jesus, the dead flesh/man, from the dead

Jesus in the Apocalypse

- I.The Alpha & Omega (1:8; 21:6; 22:13)
 - Ist & last letters of Greek alphabet
 - "I am the first and the last" (1:17; 2:8; 22:13)
- 2. The Lord God Almighty (1:8; 4:8; 11:17; 15:3; 16:7; 16:4; 19:6; 19:15; 21:22)
 - Sovereignty
- 3. The One who is and who was and who is to come (1:4; 1:8; 4:8)
 - A Greek way of saying the divine name, YHWH

Jesus/God Equality

- God: I am the Alpha and the Omega (I:8)
- Christ: I am the first and the last (I:17)
- God: I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end (21:6)
- Christ: I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end (22:13)


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
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Conclusion

Apostolic Fathers

- I. Ignatius (c. 35–c. 107)
- "God Himself was manifested in human form for the renewal of eternal life." (c. 105)
- "There is only one physician, who is both flesh and spirit, born and unborn, God in man, true life in death, both from Mary and from God, first subject to suffering and then beyond it, Jesus Christ our Lord."
 - (Letter to the Ephesians 7:2)

Apostolic Fathers

- 2. Polycarp, St. (c. 69–c. 155)
- "Now may the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the eternal High Priest himself, the Son of God Jesus Christ, build you up in faith and truth...and to all those under heaven who will yet believe in our Lord and God Jesus Christ and in his Father who raised him from the dead."
 - (Letter to the Philippians 12:2)

Apostolic Fathers

- 3. Clement of Rome (late first cent.)
- "For Christ is with those who are humble, not with those who exalt themselves over his flock. The majestic scepter of God, our Lord Christ Jesus, did not come with the pomp of arrogance or pride (though he could have done so), but in humility, just as the Holy Spirit spoke concerning him."
 - (First Clement of Rome to the Corinthians 16:1-2)

- I.Theophilus (c 180)
 - "trias" or (the three)
- 2. Tertullian (c. 160-c. 225)
 - "trinitas"

- "We pray at a minimum not less than three time in the day. For we are debtors to Three: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit." (c. 198)
- "I testify that the Father, the Son, and the Spirit are inseparable from each other... My assertion is that the Father is one, the Son is one, and the Spirit is one and that they are all distinct from each other...The Father is not the same as the Son, for they differ one from the other in the mode of their being. For the Father is the entire substance, but the Son is a derivation and portion of the whole, as He Himself acknowledges: 'My Father is greater than I.'" (c. 212)

 "When a ray is projected from the sun it is a portion of the whole sun; but the sun will be in the ray because it is a ray of the sun; the substance is not separated but extended. So from spirit comes spirit, and God from God, as light is kindled from light...This ray of God...glided down into a virgin, in her womb was fashioned as flesh, is born as man mixed with God. The flesh was built up by the spirit, was nourished, grew up, spoke, taught, worked, and was Christ."

- Monarchianism
- Denying the personal reality of the Son and the Spirit as separate from the Father
- Two forms of monarchianism developed:
- Adoptionist: Jesus as merely a prophet filled with the Spirit & "adopted" by God
- Modalism: Heresy that does not view Father, Son & Spirit as three particular "persons in relation" but merely as three modes of the one divine person of God

II. Nicene Period



- I. Constantine the Great (272–337)
- (324) Constantine's Christian church torn by a doctrinal disputation (the teaching of Arius of Alexandria)
- Constantine's goals:
 - I.To unite the Roman Empire
 - 2. To resolve the Arian controversy

- 2. Arianism
- Arius (b. don't know when. d. 336 AD)
- Argued that Christ was created by God out of nothing (an exalted creature)
- Christ was to be the instrument through which all subsequent creation would occur
- "There was when he (Jesus) was not."

- 3. Council of Nicaea (325 AD)
 - Issue: Eternal Deity/Nature of the Son
 - Heretical proponent:
 - Arius (Jesus is created)
 - Orthodox proponent:
 - Athanasius (Jesus has the same nature as God - uncreated)

- 4. Athanasius (c. 296–373) [SLIDE 24]
- Deacon and secretary to Alexander (the bishop of Alexandria). Later became bishop of Alexander
- Orthodox view: "Christ was homoousios: of the same 'substance' as the Father."
 - Eternal, not created
 - Arius: "There was a time when the Son was not."

- Ist creed (Arius): contained the term: "heteroousios"
 - "different substance"
- 2nd creed (Compromise party): homoiousios
 - "similar or like substance"
- 3rd creed (Athanasius): homoousios
 - "same substance"


"We believe in one God the Father All-sovereign, maker of all things visible and invisible;

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, begotten of the Father, only-begotten that is, of the substance of the Father, God of God, Light of Light, true God of true God, begotten not made, of one substance with the Father, through whom all things were made, things in heaven and things on the earth; who for us men and for our salvation came down and was made flesh, and became man, suffered, and rose on the third day, ascended into the heavens, is coming to judge the living and the dead."

We believe in one God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, Very God of Very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father by whom all things were made; who for us men, and for our salvation, came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary, and was made man, and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried, and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of the Father. And he shall come again with glory to judge both the quick and the dead, whose kingdom shall have no end.

And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of Life, who proceedeth from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets. And we believe one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins. And we look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.



Constantinople (381)

- Issue: Person of Christ (Is He fully human?)
 - Did he have a completely human nature?
 - If not could he really die in our place/be our savior?
- Heretical proponent: Apollinarius (Christ is divine logos, but not human spirit)
- Orthodox proponent: Basil, Gregory of Nazianzus, and Gregory of Nyssa (complete humanity of Jesus affirmed)

Constantinople (381)

- I.Apollinarius
- Apollinarius became bishop of Laodicea in 360
- Strongly anti-Arian, emphasized the full & complete divinity of Christ
 - Argued that, as a man, he did not need moral development because the divine Logos replaced his human soul
 - "Christ is fully divine, but not fully human"

Constantinople (381)

- Basil, Gregory, Gregory
 - "To be a full redeemer, Christ had to be fully human. The whole sinner needs to be renewed."
- It confirmed earlier decisions:
- I.Acceptance of the Creed of Nicaea and the homoousia of the Holy Spirit
- 2. Nicaea affirmed the full deity of Jesus, Constantinople affirmed the full humanity of Jesus

- Issue: Person of Christ: the union of the human and divine natures in Christ
- Orthodox proponent: Cyril of Alexandria
 (Complete deity of Jesus & Nicene Creed affirmed)
- Heretical proponent: Nestorious, against the full deity & humanity of Christ. Mary should NOT be called the "Mother of God" (theotokos, God-bearer)

- I. It is counted as the Third Ecumenical Council
- 2. Nestorious (bishop of Constantinople)
- Emphasized the two natures of Christ (with a division)
 - The human and divine natures were joined, but not merged

- Nestorious taught:
- Jesus was not a "God-man," but a "God-bearing man"
 - the temple in which the Logos dwelled
 - the human and the divine lived in him
- Mary should be called Christotokos (Christ-bearer) & NOT Theotokos (God-bearer)

- 3. the Council denounced Nestorius' teaching
 - decreed that Jesus was one person, not two separate people
- "We do not mean that the nature of the Word was changed and made flesh or, on the other hand, that he was transformed into a complete man consisting of soul and body, but instead we affirm this: that the Word personally united to himself flesh, endowed with life and reason, in a manner mysterious and inconceivable, and became man."
- "There is a union of persons, without confusion"

Chalcedon (451 AD)

- Issue: Person of Christ
 - How do the divine and human interact?
- Orthodox proponent: Flavian of Constantinople & Leo of Rome
 - Two natures of Jesus affirmed human & divine
- Heretical proponent: Eutyches
 - Jesus is a third unique nature

Chalcedon (451 AD)


- I. Eutyches
 - A monk, and presbyter at Constantinople
 - Strongly anti-Nestorian
 - "Christ had only ONE nature"
- The divine nature absorbed the human nature, so there no longer exists the human

Chalcedon (451 AD)

- I. The Lord Christ is one Person
 - His two natures, permanently distinct, human & divine, united in one person, with each nature performing its own function
- 2. it states that both natures, God and man, are unimpaired, "perfect,"
- 3. The distinct natures are fully God AND man,
 - Securing salvation by a saving God and a man identified with men

Chalcedon Conclusion

- If God were to step into His creation & become human, he would have a duel nature (cannot shed his deity)
 - 1). 100% God (as God, he is unchangeable, and therefore, keeps His Divine Nature)
 - 2). I00% Man (he takes on the nature of Man, completely)
- Jesus has a duel nature (100% God and 100% Man)
 - 3). Trying to use language for something completely unique in history





I. Presuppositions

- To assume something prior to arguing/ believing it
- Atheists/materialists = miracles are impossible the supernatural does not exist
- Christians/theists = supernatural exists a miraculous event occurs, a supernatural means is possible

Non-Trinitarian presuppositions

- Unitarianism:
 - the I Being of God can only be shared by I Person
- Identifying one's presuppositions will open up a new way of conversing about truth





II. Islam (Muslims)

- Jesus (Isa)
- A messenger of Allah to guide the Children of Israel with new scripture
- A great prophet
- Was born to Virgin Mary
- Performed miracles to aid in his ministry to the Jews
- Only appeared to die on cross
- Judgment: Will return for the Day of Judgment

II. Islam (Muslims)

- 5. Shirk (to share)
 - Practicing idolatry or Polytheism
- 6. Trinity (from the Qur'an)
 - "People of the Book, do not go to excess in your religion, and do not say anything about God except the truth: the Messiah, Jesus, son of Mary, was nothing more than a messenger of God, his word, directed to Mary, a spirit from Him. So believe in God and His messengers and do not speak of three - stop, that is better for you -God is only one God, He is far above having a son, everything in the heavens and earth belongs to Him and He is the best one to trust. (Sura 4:171)

II. Islam (Muslims)

- I. Jesus never claims "I am God, worship me"
- 2. Jesus always says that the "Father is greater than I"
- 3. God could never have a Son, since God is not a human (and is incapable of reproduction)
- 4. Jesus wasn't crucified, therefore couldn't have risen from the dead
- 5. Jesus (or any man) cannot atone for sin
- 6. The Bible is full of contradictions, cannot be trusted



III. Watchtower Bible & Tract Society (Jehovah's Witnesses)


- Jehovah's special creation, and is the master worker
- Preexisted as Michael the Archangel
- Jesus is a "mighty god"
- Was not born Messiah, became Messiah at baptism
- Lived a perfect and sinless life (unlike Adam)
- Died on a torture steak (not a cross)
- Was raised from the dead (by Jehovah) in the form of a spirit, not a physical body
- Is ruling God's kingdom (since 1914)

III. Watchtower Bible & Tract Society (Jehovah's Witnesses)

- B. Jehovah's Witnesses opposition/arguments for Christians:
 - I. Jesus is a created being
 - 2. Jesus prayed to God (therefore, is not himself God)
 - 3. Jesus never claimed to be Almighty God
 - 4. The Bible never explains (or defines) the Trinity
 - 5. The Roman church invented the Trinity

- I. John I:I
- JW Interpretation:
- the Word should be identified as "a god" since there is no definite article before the second "God"
- The Greek (literally) reads:
- "In beginning was the Word, and the Word was with the God, and God was the Word."

- "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
 - was: imperfect form of "to be"
 - imperfects are indefinite
- push "the beginning" (the time before creation) back as far as you want, and the Word was already in existence
- The key to John's intro
 - I:la (was)
 - 1:3 (nothing has been created that wasn't created by the Word)

- 2. Prov 8:22-30
- "The Lord possessed me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of old. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth...then I was beside him, like a master workman"
- JW Interpretation: Wisdom is the one speaking (wisdom-personified), and is the one who was

- Christian Interpretation:
 - Genre = poetry
- "Literal interp" then Jesus is:
 - a woman (8:2, 11)
 - my sister (7:4)
- Col 2:3? (in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge)
- Ancient world = attributes of a deity were often personified

- 3. Col 1:15
 - "He is the image of the invisible God, the *firstborn* of all creation."
- JW Interpretation:
 - Jesus is called the firstborn of God's creation, therefore, he is the first of Jehovah's creation

- firstborn: prototokos
 - I. Birth order (Ex 13:15)
 - 2. Special status (associated w/ being the firstborn/preeminence)
 - Ex 4:22; Rm 8:29; Hb 12:23; Col 1:18

- 4. John 17:3
 - "And this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent."
- JW Interpretation:
 - Jehovah is the only true God, and Jesus calls Him (Jehovah) greater, therefore, Jesus also can't be God.

- CONTEXT!
- 17:5 "And now, Father, *glorify me* in your own presence with the *glory* that I had with you before the world existed."

- cf. Jn 12:36-45
- ...Isaiah said these things because **he saw his glory** and spoke of him... for they loved the **glory** that comes from man more than the glory that comes from God...And whoever sees me sees him who sent me.
- cf. ls 6:1-3
- I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple... And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is **full of his glory!**"

- 5. Rev 3:14
 - "And to the angel of the church in Laodicea write: 'The words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the **beginning** of God's creation."
- JW Interpretation:
 - "Jesus was the first thing created by God"

- Christian Interpretation
- beginning = arche
 - A.Time period: Gen I:I; Jn I:I (in the beginning)
 - B. Beginning/Origin: Ps 110:10; Mk 10:6
 - C. Political:
 - Gen 40:13; Luke 20:20; Col 1:16
- The Amen is the faithful and true witness, the ruler of God's creation

- 6. John 14:28
 - "You heard me say to you, 'I am going away, and I will come to you.' If you loved me, you would have rejoiced, because I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I."
- JW Interpretation:
 - "How can Jesus be God when he says that the Father is great than he is?"



2. Jesus:

- Jesus' birth was as natural as are the births of children
- Is the literal spirit-brother of Lucifer
- After crucifixion he came to the Americas, bringing another testimony/gospel
- Jesus is 'Jehovah' (in the OT)

- "The Father of Jesus Christ is our Father also...Jesus, however, is the first born among all the sons of God—the first begotten in the spirit, and the only begotten in the flesh. He is our elder brother...All men and women are in the similitude of the universal Father and Mother, and are literally sons and daughters of Deity."
- "Two of our brothers offered to help. Our oldest brother, Jesus Christ, who was then called Jehovah, said, 'Here am I, send me' (Abraham 3:27)...Satan, who was called Lucifer, also came, saying, 'Behold, here am I, send me...Satan wanted to force us all to do his will. Under his plan, we would not be allowed to choose. He would take away the freedom of choice that our Father had given us...After hearing both sons speak, Heavenly Father said, 'I will send the first' (Abraham 3:27). Jesus Christ was chosen and ordained to be our Savior."

- "God the Father is a perfected, glorified, holy Man, an immortal Personage. And Christ was born into the world as the literal Son of this Holy Being...There is nothing figurative about his paternity; he was begotten, conceived and born in the normal and natural course of events..."
 - Bruce R. McConkie, Mormon Doctrine, p.742

- 4. The Trinity
 - Three separate Gods
- "I will preach on the plurality of Gods...I have always declared God to be a distinct personage, Jesus Christ a separate and distinct personage from God the Father, and that the Holy Ghost was a distinct personage and a Spirit: and these three constitute three distinct personages and three Gods."
- Teachings of the Prophet Joseph Smith, compiled by Joseph Fielding Smith, 1976, p. 370

- B. Mormon opposition/arguments for Christians:
- Focus on their own testimony knowing that Joseph is Heavenly Father's prophet, restoring the lost gospel
- Modern Bibles can only been trusted "as so far as its been accurately translated"
- God's revelation is progressive; other writings are authoritative (BoM; Pearl, D&C)

- C. Problematic proof texts
 - James 2:24, 26
 - a person is justified by works and not by faith alone...faith apart from works is dead.
- 1:22, 27 Be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves...Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.
- "If you say you're a Christian but you don't live in any way that looks like Jesus, are you really a Christian?"

- Focus on Monotheism
- Deut 6:4
- Is 43:10 Before me no god was formed, nor shall there be any after me.
- Is 44:6 Thus says the LORD, the King of Israel and his Redeemer, the LORD of hosts: "I am the first and I am the last; besides me there is no god.
- Is 44:24 Thus says the LORD, your Redeemer, who formed you from the womb: "I am the LORD, who made all things, who alone stretched out the heavens, who spread out the earth by myself
- Is 45:5 I am the LORD, and there is no other, besides me there is no God
